

Christmas Day

Always December 25

First Sunday after Christmas Day

Second Sunday after Christmas Day

If January 5 or before

Epiphany

Always January 6





Sundays After Epiphany

Ordinary Time until Lent

Christ is coming...

Dim the lights; pray slowly and reflectively; solemn music (e.g., O Come, O Come Emmanuel); read the OT prophecies

Christ is coming...

See back of this handout for recommended Scripture readings and collects (prayers to collect/gather/focus the thoughts of God's people)

Christ is coming...

Consider preaching a series on Christ as the promised prophet, priest, and king, or on why Christ must come to bring true hope, peace, joy, and love

Christ is coming soon...

Also anticipate the second coming

Christ has come!

Flood the sanctuary with light; triumphant songs (Joy to the World); pull out all the stops!

Christ has come!

Don't take down the decorations; keep singing Christmas songs!

Christ has come!


It's still Christmas! Christmas is a 12-day season of celebration!

The Messiah of Israel is the Savior of the Gentiles, of which the magi are the firstfruits; proclaim his universal salvation!







ADD THE MAGI TO THE MANGER SCENE

Collects

Almighty God, give us grace that we may cast away the works of darkness, and put upon us the armor of light, now in the time of this mortal life in which thy Son Jesus Christ came to visit us in great humility; that in the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge both the quick and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal; through him who liveth and reigneth with thee and the Holy Ghost, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

Blessed Lord, who has caused all holy Scriptures to be written for our learning; grant that we may in such wise hear them, read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest them, that by patience and comfort of your holy word, we may embrace and ever hold fast the blessed hope of everlasting life, which you have given us in our Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

Lord Jesus Christ, at your first coming you sent your messenger to prepare your way before you; grant that the ministers and stewards of your mysteries may likewise prepare and make ready your way, by turning the hearts of the disobedient to the wisdom of the just, that at your second coming to judge the world, we may be found an acceptable people in your sight, who lives and reigns with the Father and the Holy Spirit, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

O Lord, raise up, we pray you, your power, and come among us, and with great might help us; that whereas, through our sins and wickedness, we are sore let and hindered in running the race that is set before us, your bountiful grace and mercy may speedily help and deliver us, through the satisfaction of your Son our Lord; to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be honor and glory, world without end. Amen.

Almighty God, you have given us your only begotten Son to take our nature upon him, and as at this time to be born of a pure Virgin; grant that we, being regenerate, and made your children by adoption and grace, may daily be renewed by your Holy Spirit, through the name our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the same Spirit, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

Pray the Collect for Christmas Day

O Lord, we beseech you, mercifully to receive the prayers of your people who call upon you; and grant that they may both perceive and know what things they ought to do, and also may have grace and power faithfully to fulfill the same through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

O God, who by the leading of a star did manifest your onlybegotten Son to the peoples of the earth: Lead us, who know you now by faith, to your presence, where we may behold your glory face to face; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.
